

# Fortune Tellers

An ideal activity for two children to test each other on their spellings.

## Equipment

- Paper
- Pen

## Instructions

First you'll need a square piece of paper which can be made by taking one corner of a piece of A4 paper and dragging it to the opposite side and cutting off the excess rectangle (leaving you with a folded over square).

Fold the paper over again, so when you spread it out the square is split into 4 triangles. You are creating

creases for line guides so that it works correctly.

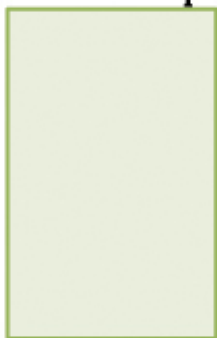
Next, fold the paper in half horizontally making it into a rectangle. Unfold it and do it again the other way around. After that, take each corner in turn and pull the corners into the centre, making a smaller square.

Flip it over so the flaps are facing downwards and repeat pulling the corners into the centre. Next, fold the square in half making a rectangle then in half again to make it easier to put your fingers under the flaps.

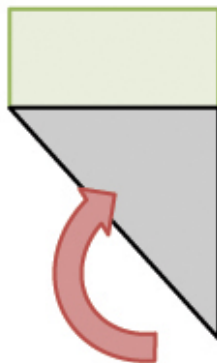
Finally, put your pointer fingers and thumbs in under the larger flaps that have an opening.

Write the spelling words inside the fortune tellers and try to use them in a sentence if you land on them.

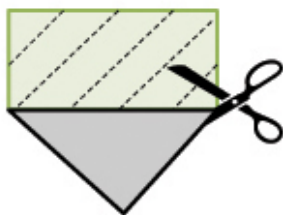
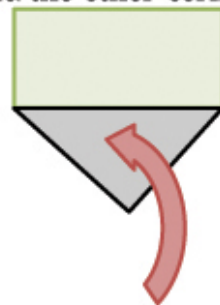
1 x sheet of A4 paper



Fold a corner



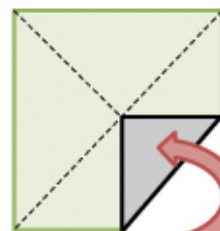
Fold the other corner



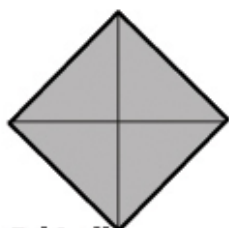
Cut along the top line



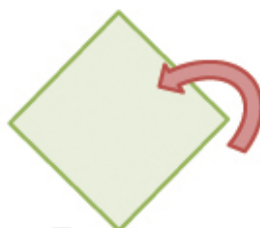
You are left with a square of paper



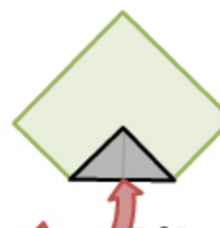
Fold a corner to the centre



Fold all corners to the centre



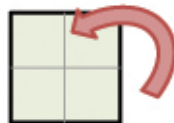
Turn over
